Each year, students in grades three through eight and high school participate in the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP).

This year, your child will take the following tests:

for English language arts/literacy and mathematics in grades three through eight and 11<sup>th</sup> grade AND

the California Science Test (CAST) in grades five and eight

To help your child get ready for the test you can:

Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep and a nutritious breakfast before testing.

On Friday, April 21<sup>st</sup> I had the honor of attending the 29<sup>th</sup> Annual C-CAP Los Angeles scholarship Awards breakfast (careers through culinary arts program), along with our awesome Vasquez High School Culinary Arts teacher Ms. Kristina Waggoner.

It was a great opportunity to not only see the awards/ scholarships the CCAP competitors receive, but to also hear more information about what a wonderful program C-CAP really is.

## Last but not least Utilization of Fiscal Capital

Yesterday we received our AB 1200 letter from the Los Angeles County Office of Education. Pursuant to Assembly Bill 1200 the Los Angeles County Supt. Of Schools has reviewed our District's proposed collective bargaining agreement with AATA and certificated mgmt. The agreement provides for a 9% on-schedule salary increase retroactive to July 1<sup>st</sup> of 2022 and a one-time 3% off-schedule payment and an increase of \$1,000 per employee to the contribution of health and welfare benefits. With these costs of the agreements incorporated, LACOE concurs that the district will meet the required reserves during the term of the agreement.

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# **COVID Report:**

As of 04/04/23, Los Angeles County is in the "low" category for CDC COVID-19 Community Levels.

LACDPH is no longer giving daily counts for covid infections in the area. Some information given maybe a week old.

Between our last report on 3/23 until 4/21 the Acton and Agua-Dulce surrounding areas there have seen 10 new cases of Covid-19.

In our AADUSD school community, there have been 5 positive cases reported since 3/23/2023, and exposure notifications have been sent for those affected.

We want to remind parents to test their students if they have any symptoms and keep them home for fever, vomiting, or unusual new cough.

CHPH wants us to remember to keep up with all immunizations that are due.

If you are a Medi-Cal recipient, they want to remind you to check your account to make sure your contact information is correct. Many people will lose their coverage in the next few months. Flyers with website information are available at all school sites and the district offices.
