## COVID-19 Community Levels.

- In the Low category, masking is strongly recommended in indoor public places if you are at risk for severe illness
- Masking is still required in healthcare settings, and for 10 days after the last day of exposure if you were a close contact to someone with COVID-19.
- In the Acton and Agua-Dulce surrounding areas there have seen 10 new cases of Covid-19 since our last report on Feb. 9th.
- In our AADUSD school community there have been 5 positive cases reported since 2/9/2023, and exposure notifications have been sent for those affected.
- We want to remind parents to test their students if they have any symptoms and keep them home for fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or unusual new cough.
- Home test kits are available at all school sites, at your local pharmacy using your Medical/Medicare card, or check with your insurance.
