This evening I will be covering the following strategic initiatives: Student Achievement, Effective Instruction and Leadership, Community Engagement, and Utilization of Fiscal Capital.

Student Achievement:

• This past summer, VHS student Marina Costan was chosen to serve on FEMA's (Federal Emergency Management Agency) Youth Preparedness Council, Region 9-along with 14 other students from California and Guam. The group met via Zoom for several months and completed their project - with a limited scope due to COVID restrictions. The group received their recognition recently for serving on the council; Marina was the only one from the Antelope Valley. Marina hopes to continue her efforts by contacting elected officials and the local town councils in order to get the word out to young and old about disaster preparedness-hoping to make the updated pamphlets a reality and maybe offer an in-person town hall to discuss ways of communicating in case of a disaster.

Since the revamping of the website, the new landing pages, as well as the new AADUSD "Take the Next Step" billboard, traffic to our homepage in particular to the "Online Enrollment" page has grown exponentially. We will continue to track efforts to identify and enhance marketing efforts.

We are happy to report, since our concerted marketing efforts by a reimaged district website, billboard marketing, a new landing page for online enrollment and a new signature programs page we have seen 25 new students to the district from late March to early May.

UTILIZATION OF FISCAL CAPITAL

On April 11th, the California Department of Education (CDE) today released K–12 public school enrollment data for the 2021–22 academic year.

The annual snapshot of fall enrollment shows a fifth year of decline as the state emerges from two challenging years of the COVID-19 pandemic. The release provides yet another data point in the continuing analysis of California's overall demographic shifts.

California enrollment declines are consistent with national data trends that show enrollment is dropping across the country. These declines began prior to the pandemic and are projected to continue into the future in California. Large urban districts in California account for close to a third of the drop in the current year.

Statewide Enrollment is down from 6,002,523 in 2020–21 to 5,892,240 in 2021–22, a decrease of more than 110,000 students and 1.8 percent from the prior year. This follows a steady decline in public school enrollment statewide since 2014–15.

With all that said, tonight we have a special presentation from Davis Demographics with our district's formal report on our short and long-term enrollment projections.

COVID Report:

Covid-19 cases across LA County continue to rise. In the Acton and Agua-Dulce surrounding areas, there have been 9 new cases this past week. In our school community, we had one exposure incident last week. Our District Health team conducted 49 PCR tests last week and none of those tests were positive. We are in the process of transitioning from Color PCR tests to Heluna Health Rapid Antigen testing. We expect this transition to be fully up and running in approximately two weeks. Our last Enhanced Health clinic of the year will be next Tuesday from 2-5 pm at the District Offices. They will be offering many vaccines, health screenings and helping people sign up for any social safety net programs they may need. Our next health clinic will be arranged for the beginning of the next school year.
