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AADUSD Counseling Corner

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) career exploration test was given to interested 10th-12th graders on Nov 9th. On Nov 30th students who completed the ASVAB were given a guided career exploration lesson in connection with their scores.

On Nov 18th the Counselors and Principal Murphy provided small group support for students on their college applications during a lunch workshop.

On Dec 3rd the Counselors and Principal Murphy provided a lunch session to support students with the AVC Registration process for the Health 120 Stress Management course that will be held on campus in the spring.

The Counselors have been continuing to meet with students regarding current grades, academic status, and next semester classes at both the middle school and high school.

In collaboration with the entire MTSS Team, the Counselors over the last two months have developed a district-wide calendar for staff to utilize in implementing weekly Socio-Emotional Learning (SEL) focused lessons to our students. This is part of our larger MTSS Implementation plan to provide Tier 1 Supports for SEL and Behavior at all three school sites.

On November 10th, the Assistance League of Antelope Valley hosted their annual Target Night for our families. The Assistance League partnership provides opportunities for our students in financial need. During the Target Night our students were allocated a gift card to purchase clothes, shoes, and school supplies. Additionally, the Assistance League provides each school site with brand new backpacks and school supplies for our students. Our counseling department attended the Target evening, to greet our families and enjoyed watching them while they shopped for their new items!

It is based on a holistic approach to stress management, rather than an approach that just teaches a variety of individual coping techniques.
